Valerie – would you please forward this to the schools committee membership.

Hi all,

I attended a meeting this morning of the Knoxville Area Coalition on Childhood Obesity. Among other agenda items, the representative from the National Dairy Council talked about a funding opportunity only available for schools from the Fuel Up to Play 60 program, which is a joint program between the dairy council and the NFL. The funding can help support healthy eating & physical activity promotions and can provide equipment for the schools. Apparently surrounding counties and cities (Oak Ridge in particular) have been successful in getting numerous grants – the monies start at \$300 and go to \$4000. Unfortunately the Knox County schools have not been active in this program, but is it available to them. I asked if it was income based and they said no – they look at the numbers but that is not the deciding factor.

I will give the packet to Gary along with the local representative's card. She is more than willing to answer questions and help the school personnel applying for a grant.

This isn't something that the Town of Farragut can do for the schools, this is something they have to initiate and carry through on their own but I thought that your committee could at least make the principals aware of the opportunities.
