MINUTES

I. Roll Call, Silent Prayer, Pledge of Allegiance

II. Approval of Agenda

Motion was made to approve May 28, 2026, Board of Mayor and Aldermen meeting agenda. Moved by Alderman Burnette, seconded by Alderman LaCroix; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

III. Approval of Minutes

A. May 14, 2026 Minutes

Motion was made to approve the May 14, 2026, Board of Mayor and Aldermen Meeting Minutes. Moved by Alderman Burnette, seconded by Alderman Cain; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

IV. Mayor's Report

Town Administrator David Smoak provided an update on the sewer overflow incident. He advised that conversations had taken place with employees to ensure proper call routing procedures. He stated that First Utility District (FUD) has been proactive in posting water level updates and that the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) will make the final determination regarding when the creek may reopen. He also stated that internal conversations have taken place regarding remediation efforts for the area surrounding the creek and restoring wildlife to the area.

Mayor Williams congratulated the Farragut High School Class of 2026 on their graduation.

Alderman Burnette recognized the Farragut High School athletic teams and acknowledged the success they achieved during their respective seasons.

Alderman Cain stated that the Farragut Rotary Club will be hosting the "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" event on the upcoming Saturday, during which volunteers will build beds to be donated to children in the Knox County area.

V. Ordinances & Resolutions

A. Ordinances

1. First Reading

- a. Approval of Ordinance 26-12, an Ordinance of the Town of Farragut, Tennessee on First Reading, Amending the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Capital Investment Program Fund Budget, Passed by Ordinance 25-10.

Motion was made to approve Ordinance 26-12 on the first reading. Moved by Vice-Mayor Meyer, seconded by Alderman Cain; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

2. Second Reading & Public Hearing

- a. Approval of Ordinance 26-11, ordinance on second reading adopting the annual budget for the Town of Farragut for Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027

Motion was made to approve Ordinance 26-11, ordinance on second reading, adopting the annual budget for the Town of Farragut for Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027. Moved by Vice-Mayor Meyer, seconded by Alderman Cain; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

B. Resolutions

1. Approval of Resolution R-26-08, Fiscal Year 2027 Fee Schedule

Motion was made to approve Resolution R-26-08, Fiscal Year 2027 Fee Schedule. Moved by Vice-Mayor Meyer, seconded by Alderman Burnette; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

VI. Business Items

- A. Approval of Award of Contract 2026-29 Campbell Station Road / Jamestowne Boulevard Intersection Improvements to Stansell Electric Company, Inc.

Alderman Burnette and Alderman LaCroix expressed concerns regarding the absence of a traffic signal at the opposite end of the Jamestowne Road and Kingston Pike intersection, as well as the potential traffic impacts. Town Administrator David Smoak stated that the planned Municipal Center Drive extension project would include a traffic study to provide a better understanding of how traffic patterns may change.

Motion was made to approve the award of contract 2026-29, Campbell Station Road / Jamestowne Boulevard Intersection Improvements to Stansell Electric Company, Inc. Moved by Vice-Mayor Meyer, seconded by Alderman Cain; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

B. Approval of Change Orders 1, 2, and 3 to contract 2026-16 for the construction of McFee Park Dog Park

Motion was made to approve the COs 1, 2, and 3 to contract number 2026-16 for a revised total \$671,916 and including a revised 5% contingency for potential change orders in the amount of \$33,595.80 to the project budget and allowing the Town Administrator to approve up to \$25,000 in change orders before bringing to the Board of Mayor Aldermen for approval. Moved by Alderman Burnette, seconded by Alderman Cain; voting yes, Alderman Burnette, Alderman Cain, Alderman LaCroix, Vice-Mayor Meyer, Mayor Williams; voting nay, None; motion Passed.

VII. Citizens Forum

Kim Parks - 10701 Farragut Hills Blvd

Town Administrator David Smoak addressed Ms. Parks' concerns, advising that the Board had discussed the position and voted that it was a necessary role. He stated that economic development is a long-term process and does not happen overnight.

Alderman LaCroix also addressed the concerns, noting that the position had been discussed during multiple meetings and that key performance indicators (KPIs) would be established for the role under the supervision of Town Administrator Smoak. He stated that if Ms. Parks wished to review the KPIs, she could contact him to arrange a meeting to discuss them further.

Alderman Burnette clarified that Mr. Hobb's original position was Assistant to the Town Administrator and not Economic Developer, and that the economic development responsibilities were added later.

Alderman Cain stated that the Knox County Sheriff's Office conducted an alcohol compliance operation and that all Farragut businesses included in the operation successfully passed the compliance checks.

VIII. Town Administrator's Report

Town Administrator David Smoak reviewed the following FY26 budget line item transfer with the board:
